Principals and teachers of Industry Studies and VET Content Endorsed Courses (CECs) are reminded that the completion of mandatory work placement is required for satisfactory course completion. Students

who fail to complete the mandatory work placement component of a course may be liable for a 'N' (Non-completion of course requirements) determination (Section 11.4.5.2 Assessment, Certification and Accreditation (ACE) Manual, 1999).

Where a Year 12 student of Industry Studies or a VET CEC has not yet met work placement requirements, and there are grounds for believing that these may not be met by the end of Term 3, 2000, warning notices should be issued according to procedures in Section 15.3 of the ACE Manual, 1999. Principals are advised to issue any warnings as soon as possible so that there is sufficient time for the problem to be corrected. The final date for issuing 'N' determinations is Friday 18 August 2000.

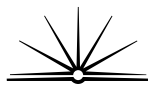

The Board of Studies provides for the endorsement of school-designed VET courses for Stage 6. This allows schools the opportunity to offer vocational courses in industry areas not otherwise available in the HSC curriculum.

Schools interested in seeking endorsement of such courses can obtain guidelines and application forms from the Office of the Board of Studies by calling (02) 9367 8277.

Criteria for endorsement include that the proposed course:

- does not duplicate or substantially overlap an existing VET HSC course
- is based on an endorsed national training package or, if a national training package is not available, consists of national or other accredited VET modules
- provides clearly defined pathways to VET qualifications under the Australian Qualifications Framework or, where national qualifications are not available, provides arrangements for articulation into further training
- addresses student demand, industry training needs and employment opportunities
- meets Board of Studies unit structure and indicative hours requirements
- specifies a component of work placement appropriate to the industry and course outcomes
- is included in the scope of registration of the delivering Registered Training Organisation (RTO)
- has the support of the relevant school system authority.



The closing date for applications to the Board for school-designed VET courses proposed for 2001 is Friday 8 September 2000. Schools should note, however, that applications requiring school system approval will need to reach the school system authority well in advance of this date. (The Department of Education and Training has set Friday 21 July as its closing date. Schools in other systems should seek advice from the relevant system authority.)

Schools are reminded that the closing date for non-VET Board Endorsed Course applications is Friday 16 June 2000.

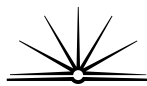

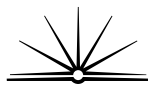

For verse texts, any author from the period c 100BC – c AD100 may be studied in the Preliminary course except for the Book of the *Aeneid* of Virgil which is prescribed for the HSC in the following year.'

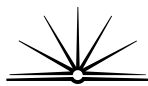
From 2000 the School Certificate Test in Australian History, Geography, Civics and Citizenship will be based on the Stage 5 History (mandatory) and Geography (mandatory) courses in the 1998 syllabuses.

The Australian History section of the test consists of two parts, as specified on page 50 of the syllabus. Questions in Part A are based on two or three topics from the Stage 5 History (mandatory) course identified for the purposes of the test each year. Part B consists of questions drawn from the five focus issues based on a broad coverage of the syllabus content.

The nominated topics for Part A of the History section of the tests in 2000–2003 are:

- 2000 Trial Test Topic 3 Australia Between the Wars
- Topic 5 Post-War Australia to the 1970s
- Trial Topic 1 Australian Social and Political Life to 1914
- Topic 6 Social and Political Issues from the 1970s to the 1990s
- 2002 Test Topic 1 Australian Social and Political Life to 1914
- Topic 5 Post-War Australia to the 1970s
- 2003 Test Topic 1 Australian Social and Political Life to 1914
- Topic 5 Post-War Australia to the 1970s
