- Both notices have 3 big bedrooms.
- Both notices are suitable for families.
- Notice 1 is available at the beginning of April whereas Notice 3 is available at the end of April.
- Notice 1 is located in the south and Notice 3 is located in the north.

Joel doesn't see the point of going somewhere to drink every day. Antoine thinks that it is an essential part of finishing school.

Justifies the answer with appropriate reference to Mr Dupont's and Antoine's entries	4
Demonstrates a satisfactory understanding of the arguments that Mr Dupont's daughter could use to try to change her father's mind	3
• Justifies the answer with some reference to Mr Dupont's and Antoine's entries	3
Demonstrates some understanding of the arguments that Mr Dupont's daughter could use to try to change her father's mind	2
Demonstrates a limited understanding of the arguments that Mr Dupont's daughter could use to try to change her father's mind	1

#### Sample answer:

Mr Dupont's daughter could suggest contributing financially, that she can have fun without drinking, that the media exaggerates and that he should learn to trust her.

#### Sample answer:

The mother will stay in France with another teacher from the high school and spend her days in class.

#### Sample answer:

The grandmother will be conflicted in having to please both her daughter and granddaughter. The daughter requests that she not allow Natasha to go out with her cousins, as she is too young, whereas Natasha wants to go clubbing with her cousins. Natasha assumes that she is staying with a host family; however, her mother wants her to stay with her grandmother.
