Stefan is always tired and falls asleep in class. He doesn't get his homework done and his marks are poor. He is obsessed with sports and stays up all hours to watch sport on TV. Silke is concerned that Stefan doesn't listen to her advice.

Sample answer:

- Paul wants to borrow Julia's iPad.
- Julia is unwilling to lend it as she thinks he will damage it.
- Julia needs the iPad herself.
- Paul threatens to reveal how much time she wastes playing on the iPad.

Sample answer:

The dilemma is having to make a choice between going to the aquarium and going hiking. Depending on the weather, the family might have to change their plans for what to do with the exchange student on the weekend. If it is raining, they could go to the aquarium instead of hiking in the countryside. They are concerned as to whether taking an Australian to an aquarium would be worthwhile, as surely he would have seen better aquariums in Australia.

Question 12 (b)

Question 12 (c)

• Clearly shows how predictions about health for Leos and Librans are different	3
• Shows some understanding of the health predictions for Leos and/or Librans	2
Provides a piece of relevant information	1

Sample answer:

Leos have been told to watch their diet and limit sugar or risk health problems; whereas Librans are reminded to not skip meals despite a hectic schedule. They are advised to eat 3 regular healthy meals and avoid fast food.



Question 13 (a)

Sample answer:

Academically, she is best at Sport and foreign languages; she also participates in the extracurricular activities of drama and IT.

Sample answer:

Claudia's parents might advise her to concentrate better in class and be more diligent with homework. They could give her extra help in Science. They might consider cutting back on Claudia's sporting commitments.

Sample answer:

The website was misleading, rooms were old-fashioned and dirty, internet was expensive and slow, breakfast room was overcrowded.

Sample answer:

The manager was very apologetic and responded immediately. He explained the hotel was making changes and acknowledged the faults. He also offered them a free weekend in the newly renovated hotel. And, in addition, he invited them on a boat trip along the coast.
