Sample answer:

Dimitris's comments make Eleni reflect on her values and encourage her to think about following up with some research about volunteer work. She is inspired by him and seeks his assistance.

Question 5

Sample answer:

The concert is promoted through the speaker's use of persuasive language (use of adjectives), and the repetition of the fact that no-one should miss this concert. Also, through the speaker highlighting the singer's positive attributes (voice, down to earth personality), the fact that the proceeds of the concert will be donated, and that her music appeals to both young and old.

Sample answer:

Polyxeni presents a confident, successful and enthusiastic attitude. She cites successful past work experiences (successful supervision of three staff members), compliments the company and her interviewer (renowned company and good reputation), and uses persuasive language (rhetorical questions and positive adjectives) to describe her qualities.

Sample answer:

Stelios is anxious because he has to drive on the dangerous roads and is worried about the children. He also shows he is not a risk-taker because he prefers to be on the beach. Marina on the other hand is determined and sentimental because she wants to visit the location of her grandfather's grave. She also shows she is confident because she feels comfortable enough to take over the driving. Both speakers, however, are flexible enough to reach a compromise at the end where Marina offers to drive and Stelios is happy to enjoy the view as a result.

Sample answer:

In this interview, the interviewer's enthusiasm through his voice, tone and use of adjectives to describe the author and the book encourages the audience to purchase this book. The fact that it is easy to read, it is based on a true story and provides a more humane perspective of the plight of refugees, as opposed to what we read in the media, further encourages people to buy it. Finally, the interviewer urges the audience to rush out today to buy the book and read it.

Sample answer:

The title 'How lucky are we, really!', is appropriate as it reflects the sarcastic tone of the article. The use of the exclamation mark encourages the reader to want to read further as the title appears to be ambiguous.

Sample answer:

The author makes us think about the excessive use of technology in today's world and questions whether our lives have actually improved and where this will lead us in the future. He achieves this through the sarcastic tone (Σε τι ωραίο και θαυμαστό κόσμο ζούμε σήμερα!) and the use of short succinct sentences (Υπάρχει ευκολότερος τρόπος απ' αυτόν;), rhetorical questions (Είναι πράγματι η ζωή μας καλύτερη;), the use of emotive words (θυσιάσαμε, αναμφισβήτητα).

Sample answer:

She re-evaluates her priorities in her life and realises that what really matters is having compassion for your fellow human beings. She is inspired to raise funds to build a school. This will ensure more students have access to education that is closer to the village. She also decides to learn their language in order to communicate better with them.

The children's lives will change because they will not walk as far to get to school and they will receive a broader education. They will also be provided with food and clothing.

Sample answer:

Elpida feels admiration, gratitude and compassion for Amika and her friends. This is achieved through the use of direct speech throughout (σ'εσένα, κοντά σας), the use of a sincere tone (πώς να ξεχάσω), her repetition of terms of endearment (Αμίκα μου), and the use of emotive language (συμπόνια, συγκίνηση).
