

2011 Vietnamese Continuers HSC Examination 'Sample Answers'

When examination committees develop questions for the examination, they may write 'sample answers' or, in the case of some questions, 'answers could include'. The committees do this to ensure that the questions will effectively assess students' knowledge and skills.

This material is also provided to the Supervisor of Marking, to give some guidance about the nature and scope of the responses the committee expected students would produce. How sample answers are used at marking centres varies. Sample answers may be used extensively and even modified at the marking centre OR they may be considered only briefly at the beginning of marking. In a few cases, the sample answers may not be used at all at marking.

The Board publishes this information to assist in understanding how the marking guidelines were implemented.

The 'sample answers' or similar advice contained in this document are not intended to be exemplary or even complete answers or responses. As they are part of the examination committee's 'working document', they may contain typographical errors, omissions, or only some of the possible correct answers.



Section I — Listening and Responding Part A

Question 1 (b)

Sample answer:

Mr Nguyen's room is in Building C; Room 23.

Question 1 (c)

Sample answer:

Enter the back gate, turn left and you will find the parking area.

Question 2

Sample answer:

The purposes of the announcement are:

- to inform the Vietnamese community about the Food Festival
- to encourage people to bring along others who are not familiar with Vietnamese food
- to encourage people to buy more food in order to raise more money for flood relief

Sample answer:

Young people should have the right to choose their partners.

Question 4 (b)

Answers could include:

Thu resembles her character in the following ways:

- same hairstyle, the way she dresses

Question 5 (a)

Sample answer:

Anh had to stay in Vietnam longer than she had planned.

Question 5 (b)

Sample answer:

The Manager sacked Anh because the company has lost customers, so the staffing has to be reduced. In fact, he is jealous of Anh because Anh is smart and more popular than he is. He blames Anh for losing customers, even though he knows the global economic crisis is the real cause.

The Manager doesn't like Anh because she criticises his decision to reduce the number of working days. As Union Representative, Anh speaks up to protect workers' rights and interests; however, in such a situation, she is against the good strategy that could prevent workers from losing their jobs.

The Manager doesn't like the fact that Anh is working as his assistant so he speeds up the process of terminating her contract.

Question 6

Sample answer:

Yen is giving up her singing career because she:

Section II — Reading and Responding Part A

Question 8 (a)

Sample answer:

Thanh is a Vietnamese girl who came to Australia when she was in high school. She is now working as an accountant in Sydney.

Question 8 (b)

Sample answer:

In the second diary entry, Thanh thought of Sydney as a big and modern city. She thought that the people seemed busy and unfriendly.

Question 8 (c)

Sample answer:

She is writing the third diary entry because after she received a Christmas card from her guardian she reflects on the past when she struggled to adapt to the Australian lifestyle. She reflects on what happened at the Christmas party in her company when she realised that she can never be a 'real' Australian. She is confused because she is unsure about what community she belongs to.

Question 9 (a)

Sample answer:

Dr Ha is a professor who is teaching at a university in the School of Medicine. He is also an author of many books.

Question 9 (b)

Sample answer:

The main points of the speech are the benefits of cloning animals and plants. The speech mentions some available research that supports the idea of human cloning and also expresses Dr Ha's attitude towards the opposite points of view.

Question 9 (c)

Sample answer:

The writer of the article agrees with Professor Ha only when the cloning is applied to animals and plants. He does not agree when Professor Ha introduced cloning as a perfect method which can make perfect people. He uses techniques such as the use of statistics, sarcasm, metaphorical language to criticise Professor Ha's attitude regarding human cloning.
