Minister for Education and Training Verity Firth today announced 60 HSC Drama students have been selected to perform in the 2009 OnSTAGE season.

Ms Firth said students were chosen from across the State for their exceptional individual and group performances, set and costume design, script writing, theatre review, promotion and program, and video drama.

"Congratulations to all of the HSC students selected to perform and exhibit in OnSTAGE, which will run from February 6 to 12 at Sydney's Seymour Centre," Ms Firth said.

"These students represent a sample of the world-class talent emerging from our schools.

"They have explored a range of sophisticated and diverse themes, such as genetic engineering, making the most of life, greed, the universal need for fulfilment and the economy.

"Being chosen for OnSTAGE gives each of these students an excellent opportunity to present their work to a wide audience in a professional setting."

Ms Firth thanked the teachers and parents who have nurtured the state's talented young performers throughout the year.

- An exhibition of individual projects in set design, scriptwriting and critical analysis.

OnSTAGE is presented by the Board of Studies NSW in partnership with the NSW Department of Education and Training.
