Universal Declaraction of Human Rights
Is a declaration adopted by the UN General
Assembly. It arose after WWZ to ensure nothing
like WWZ ever hoppens again. It represents the
first global expression of rights to which all
human beings are inherently entitled
Age Discrimation Act 2004 (Commonwealth)
Helps to ensure that people are not treated
less favourably on the ground of age in various
areas of public life.
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Non-Légal Responses
Lobby Circups.
A labby group is an organised group of
people that aim to influence the policies or
actions of government.
Example: Superannuation Association which represents
the views of retirees

The UDHR is the example given of the way international agreements can influence culture and law. This is not, however, an explicit legal example for an Australian context

The Age Discrimination Act is a highly relevant legal example. The explanation of the Act is succinct. Elaboration would improve the response

Lobby groups, with specific links made to the Superannuation Association, provide the foundation for a valid non-legal example

The Media

The media is an overarching non-legal example that requires specificity. A more explicit framework for discussion in relation to this topic and the particular disadvantaged group is required

## **Grade Commentary**

A simple summary is provided in relation to two legal and non-legal examples demonstrating a basic knowledge and understanding. The selection of four examples (three relevant) demonstrates an organised research and selection process. The explanation is elemental in that it requires elaboration and explicit links to concepts connected to age discrimination and disadvantage, written in essay format.

Kai's response demonstrates characteristics of work typically produced by a student performing at a grade D standard.
