

## Summary of Classical Greek Continuers HSC examination specifications and assessment requirements from 2010

In December 2008, the Board of Studies approved changes to the examination specifications and assessment requirements for a number of courses. The HSC examination specifications and assessment requirements for Classical Greek Continuers are outlined below.

### **Outline of HSC examination specifications**

A written examination of three hours plus 5 minutes reading time.

### Changes from current examination specifications

There is an increase of 10 marks in questions related to unseen texts (Section III), with a corresponding reduction of 5 marks in each of Sections I and II. Section III contains translations of unseen texts, both verse and prose, as well as short-answer and/or objective response questions based on these texts.

In Sections I and II, there will be no choice in the extended response questions. The expected length for the responses to the 10-mark questions is included as a guide. It is presented as the approximate number of examination writing booklet pages (based on average-sized handwriting), and/or an approximate number of words. Students will not be penalised for responses of excess length: they may write less than or more than what is expected, and their responses will be marked on their merits.

### **Outline of internal assessment requirements**

There will be three to five assessment tasks. There are no changes to the components and weightings.
