(b) Government programs and strategies in the local Bundjalung Nation and the Maori community of Auckland have assisted in addressing criminal justice issues faced by Indigenous communities however have not yet solved all issues within the criminal justice system.

In the Bundjalung community programs such as "Balunda" the wall-less prison at Tabulam NSW has ^{assisted in} addressing the issue of over representation of Aboriginal people in the prisons. "Balunda" has assisted ^{young} Aboriginal people in getting re connected to their culture and traditional Aboriginal heritage. Balunda is run by local Aboriginal Elders who assist in turning the offenders lives around by the activities they provide.

Another government program is the IPROUD program where young Aboriginal people can stay clear of doing crimes

and join the Police force through a nine month course.

The position of an ACLO - Aboriginal Community Liaison Officer provides the community with a familiar face who works with the police in addressing crime issues within the region.
