The unemployment rate for Indigenous people is 38% when compared with 8.7% of the non-Indigenous population. This shows that there are less Indigenous people that are unemployed than non-Indigenous.

The government has put in place programs to help Indigenous people gain employment, such as the Aboriginal Employment Strategy (AES) which helps Indigenous people ~~to~~ seek employment, and gain traineeships and apprenticeships to gain skills that ~~are~~ ^{are} required to have in a certain job that, that person may want to undertake.

~~Other~~ In other countries the Indigenous people also have a lower employment rate when compared to the non-Indigenous population. Another ^{Indigenous} community other than in Australia which also face challenges in employment is

The Lakota people, the Indigenous community in Canada, the Lakota people face very similar ~~but~~ challenges in the area of employment, since they were also colonised by the same country that Australia was colonised by. The Lakota people have less people who are employed than the non-Indigenous community.

Indigenous people face challenges within the Criminal Justice system in Australia. ~~Indigenous~~ Indigenous people are more than 17 times more likely to get ~~are~~ arrested, they are more than 18 more times likely to be imprisoned and more than 16 more times likely to die in custody than non-Indigenous people in Australia. For many years Indigenous people in Australia have been ~~discriminated~~ discriminated against and treated unfairly because when they were colonised all their rights were taken away and over many years they had to fight to get them back. Even now days the Indigenous people of Australia ~~are~~ are still fighting for their rights.
