When research and wishing to attain information on the experiences and perspectives of Aboriginal people, one should employ ethical research practises. To conclude the research or interview, explain and share your personal background and why you are interested in attain the information and what purpose it would serve. Explain what the information would be use for. Assume that you respect Indigenous knowledge but making a point that any questions or enquires that are not appropriate or invade cultural barrier do not need to be answered. Further it is important to acknowledge any cultural protocols such as not making eye contact or asking a male about 'women's business' as this is not appropriate.

When conducting the interview do not push a bias or particular view that will impact on the accurate information the Indigenous person is sharing. ~~It~~ similarly ~~not~~ understand that not all ~~Indigenous~~ Aboriginal people have the same view point on particular topics and

that not all Aboriginal people want to talk about past occurrences. ~~respe when~~ It is important to respect indigenous knowledge and that some is sacred and can not be share, also respect that there is a difference between understanding of scientific and spiritual beliefs that can often be conflicting. Evidently it is important to respect ~~these stated~~ ~~consu~~ consultation protocols and indigenous knowledge so that you can attain a truthful reflection of that particular person on their experiences and perspectives without shaping their response to the answer you may wish to acquire, this ~~further more~~ it is a respectful way to conduct yourself. Further more it is critical that you acknowledge the ~~wrote~~ intellectual property and copyright, in that archiving you make it evident that you attained this information from that particular person, and ensure they are happy with ~~your~~ your portrayal of their information. show them a copy ~~and~~ of your product.

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that uses their information and check that they are happy for it to be there. It is important that you use these ethical research practices to ensure that cultural property and representation of people are accurate and not share without approval.
