a) client centered care - when the client has the ability to choose what care they would like to help them.

confidentiality - when the information about someone or something has to be kept from any individuals that don't need the information.

Duty of care - The responsibility of someone to ensure the person that is being looked after is healthy and alive. Not neglected.

b) The client centered care relates to aged ~~the~~ care. Aged care relies on client centered care due to elderly not completely being able to look after themselves.

Some elderly's may have alzheimers which impairs their memory. They won't be able to remember if they have eaten, or gone to the toilet. With the client centered

Care, it will be much more effective, involving routines to help care for the clients.

Aged care has to withhold information about the client unless the next of kin ask for it.

The staff are not allowed to release any information due to the repercussions that may occur. If word got out about a certain patient, things could be said, and they may not want anyone to know. So confidentiality is meant to keep the patient feeling secure about their information ~~not~~ being released into the hands of people they don't know and people that they don't want them to know.

The duty of care in a Aged Care work place is significant. For older age people who can't look after themselves, they need someone to do it. Some might not know

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if they have had food or not. Over feeding or under-feeding them can be significant to their health & wellbeing.

Or when they have human waste in their bed. You cant leave it otherwise it's neglect and you won't be doing the proper duty of care.

So when being asked if they have been fed or not, you should know the answer, if not ask someone to see if they have. Also if you see human waste in the bed, you have the duty of care to clean it up.
