a) Client centred care: client centred care is the importance of the client and focuses on the client as a whole. It is important to understand the client, their priorities and the health and wellbeing of the client.

Confidentiality: confidentiality is keeping the privacy of the client. It is important for confidentiality as the client is able to have trust in the nurse, team and industry. It is important to keep all records confidential until consent is gained from the client.

Duty of care: Duty of care is the care in which a professional team has to the individual and their needs. Duty of care recognises the individuals ethics and understandings. It is important for each health professional to understand and know what their duty of care is.

b) client

Start here.

Client centred care in the allied health environment is extremely important, by focusing on the client as a whole the team is able to identify any changes within the client. It is important to understand the client's priorities, ethics, behaviour and understanding. Through this the health care team is able to focus on the client's health and wellbeing. And is ultimately able to recognise ~~the~~<sup>any</sup> changes within the client. Without client centred care the structure of the health team and client relationship will denture.

Client centred care allows and caters for the client being ~~careed~~<sup>careed</sup> for as a whole. ~~But~~ By establishing this regular observations are able to be carried out as well as tests if need be and a appropriate relationship can be maintained.

example: Mr \_\_\_\_\_ has come into the allied health setting with a broken arm and ribs on his left side, Mr \_\_\_\_\_ gets a health care team, whilst in hospital Mr \_\_\_\_\_ becomes depressed unhappy, through client centred care the team recognises this change and is able to implement ideas for him to get back to himself. Without client centred care the health team will not recognise his change or cater for it.

Confidentiality is keeping the privacy of the client maintained. Without confidentiality anyone in the allied health care setting would be able to look over the individuals records. Without confidentiality trust between the individual and the health care team can have the potential to be ruined. Confidentiality is ~~important~~ <sup>to be maintained</sup>, until consent is given by the individual and consent must be valid.

Confidentiality ~~is~~ ~~not~~ is not allowed to be given out to anyone not in the health care team or anyone who has not gained consent. It is the health care teams duty of care to keep confidentiality as it is illegal to break confidentiality.

Example: Mrs \_\_\_\_\_ is an individual who likes to keep to herself she has come into the allied health care setting with a UTI, she wants her confidentiality maintained and has only given consent to her two daughters and husband as well as the health care team. Because of this the health care team go to lengths to protect Mrs \_\_\_\_\_'s confidentiality. And to keep the relationship maintained.

Duty of care is extremely

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Important in the allied health care setting. It is the care in which a professional team take on for an individual. without Duty of care the structure of the allied health service will rapture.

Duty of care is important as it outlines what lengths the health care team are able to take on in regards to the client. without Duty of care Client confidentiality and Client centred care can not be properly looked at or understood.

Duty of care in the allied health service is the care in which the professional team undertakes for that individual.

example: Miss                      ~~admitted~~ was admitted for mental health issues she tries to keep committing suicide it is the teams duty of care to prevent this, and report this to professionals.
