(b) The notion of state sovereignty regarding the assistance ^{as} ~~and~~ well as the impedence of resolving world order issues plays a large role in ensuring international peace between nation states as well as the international community.

State sovereignty refers to the legal and political power of a state to make laws and enforce those laws on its people without any undue influence from another state unless consent is given. The idea of state sovereignty is highly effective in assisting the resolution of world order issues as nation states respect the concept in order to avoid danger being inflicted upon them by another state if ~~the~~ a nation state breaches the other's state sovereignty. if breached, a state is able to take the other state to the International Court of Justice (ICJ) where the dispute is able to be resolved without ~~the~~ any type of warfare occurring. A primary example where state sovereignty has assisted a nation state in ^{enforcing} ~~maintaining~~ its own laws is the separation of North and South Korea.

Another advantage to state sovereignty is the independence it gives to a state

State sovereignty can also impede the resolution of world order issues due to a nation state being more subjected to a state of tyranny and dictatorship, ~~the~~ and the ~~the~~ international community is unable to intervene unless serious crimes against humanity such as genocide occur. e.g. Syria conflict.
