### HSC unit credit and course requirements

HSC unit credit for VET courses can be accredited to the Preliminary and/or HSC pattern of study.

#### Animal Care (240 indicative hours)

- accredited for a total of 4 units at the Preliminary and/or HSC level
- attempt all Group 1 units of competency and units of competency from Group 2 and/or Group 3 to a minimum of 140 HSC indicative hours
- undertake a minimum of 70 hours of mandatory work placement.

For a course to count towards the HSC program of study students must satisfy the course completion criteria as required by the Board of Studies. Refer to Section 8.4 of the *Assessment, Certification and Examination (ACE) Manual*.

The pattern of study entered (for example 2 units x 2 years) should reflect the delivery of the course over successive years. Students will be credentialled for the HSC unit credit entered each calendar year provided they have satisfactorily completed the course requirements for that calendar year as determined by the school/RTO.

Under some circumstances, students' part-time work in an appropriate workplace may be used to fulfil work placement requirements. Refer to the *Assessment, Certification and Examination (ACE) Manual* or relevant Board of Studies Official Notices for further details.

### AQF VET credential

To attain Certificate II in Animal Studies (RUV20104) students must achieve 10 units of competency including:

- all core units from Group 1 (5 units of competency)
- 3 elective units from Group 2
- an additional 2 elective units from Group 2 and/or Group 3.
