### Course requirements

This course will be credentialled as a 100-hour elective.

Students must attempt:

- all mandatory units of competency
- one industry/technical unit of competency (compulsory) from a specialisation area
- elective units of competency to a minimum of 45 indicative hours (to obtain Certificate I in Manufacturing (Pathways) (MSA10107) students must achieve five elective units of competency).

Students will study this course with a focus on one specialisation. The four areas for specialisation are:

- timber
- cloth
- metal
- plastic.

Students must satisfy the course completion criteria as required by the Board of Studies. Refer to Section 4.3 of the *Assessment, Certification and Examination (ACE) Manual*.

## Access to VET by students in Years 9 and 10

Undertaking a VET course in Years 9 and 10 is an option for students as part of a broad general education leading to recognised schooling and VET sector qualifications. Students must also complete the mandatory curriculum requirements for Stage 5, including the development of essential literacy and numeracy skills.

\* The construction induction certificate (CIC card) will be issued by WorkCover NSW upon provision of evidence from an RTO that competence has been achieved in CPCCOHS1001A *Work safely in the construction industry*.

The CIC card has replaced the card previously issued to participants who completed the WorkCover NSW *General Induction for Construction Work in NSW*. This change came into effect from 1 September 2009 to comply with the *National Code of Practice for Induction for Construction Work*. The CIC card will be recognised throughout Australia.

### AQF VET qualification

To obtain Certificate I in Manufacturing (Pathways) (MSA10107) students must achieve nine units of competency including:

- a) three core units of competency
- b) six elective units of competency including:
  - one unit of competency from the industry/technical units
  - a minimum of two units of competency from the listed electives
  - a maximum of three units of competency selected from this Training Package, other endorsed Training Packages and accredited courses where those units are available for inclusion at Certificate I or II.
