## Introduction

The VET Industry Curriculum Framework course descriptions are designed to:

- assist students in planning their courses of study for the Higher School Certificate (HSC)
- provide succinct information to parents about HSC VET courses
- assist teachers, schools and Registered Training Organisations (RTOs) delivering HSC VET courses in providing accurate course information to students.

This document includes an individual course description for the 120 indicative hours course and the 240 indicative hours courses in each of the VET Industry Curriculum Frameworks available in the HSC. Information on specialisation study courses, extension courses and school-based apprenticeship pathway courses (if applicable) are available in the Part A Syllabus document for each Framework.

Each course description seeks to summarise information on HSC course requirements and the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF) VET qualification/s to which the course relates. A brief statement regarding potential employment outcomes is also included.

It is emphasised that this is summary information only and that definitive information on HSC curriculum, assessment and certification should be sourced from the Part A Syllabus, Part B Syllabus and Assessment and Reporting document for each Framework and from the Board of Studies *Assessment, Certification and Examination (ACE) Manual*.

The course descriptions have been designed, as far as possible, to assist schools/RTOs in addressing requirements for providing information to students specified in Australian Quality Training Framework (AQTF) standards for VET.

Course descriptions can be adapted to tailor information to their particular school/college/RTO. Care must be taken to ensure this does not compromise the accuracy of the information.
