OPTION 1. BIOPHYSICAL STUDIES

EITHER

1. Choose ONE of the four components of the biophysical environment. Account for variations in the behaviour of this component over time and space.

OR

2. With reference to a major study of ONE environmental issue, identify the forces causing change, and evaluate the sensitivity to disturbance within the component of the biophysical environment you have selected.

OPTION 2. DEVELOPMENT GEOGRAPHY

EITHER

3. Using sample studies, analyse the internal forces that influence the different levels and rates of development of nations.

OR

4. Evaluate the appropriateness of quantitative and qualitative indicators as measures of development.

OPTION 3. POLITICAL GEOGRAPHY

EITHER

5. Using sample studies, analyse the various paths taken towards conflict resolution at a variety of scales.

OR

6. Evaluate the impacts of political tensions and conflicts on people and environments.
