Question 9 (d)

Sample answer:

He reinforces his frustration by using a number of synonyms to express the same thing. This is for emphasis eg zilch / zero; lifeless / futureless; useless / luckless. This to reinforces his feeling of frustration and despair.

He also emphasises the degree to which he has been unsuccessful; lots and lots and lots (of failure) never ever (has a job). These superlatives emphasise and reinforce his frustration. He feels completely abound and on his own. He is sure no one can feel the loneliness he feels. This is underlined in the way he asks and answers his own questions.

His choice to speak about his failure reveals his despair. The fact that this has lead him to hallucinate also uncovers his miserable state.
