His mother wanted him to study harder.

Question 9 (a)

Sample answer:

Question 10 (c)

Sample answer:

Question 10 (d)

Sample answer:

The author is a new arrival student from China eager to be accepted and make friends in his new school. He is shy and lacks self-confidence and is afraid of rejection. He likes playing and watching basketball games. He is an obedient son who follows his mother's instructions.

Question 10 (e)

Sample answer:

The basketball is a precious item because it was signed by Yao Ming. The basketball represents a form of communication that doesn't require language. When the author had the ball at the beginning of the story, it was used as his confidence and support — it's so special to him that he never lets anyone play with it. When it was rolled on the ground, it symbolised surprise and happiness; when it was tossed at the end of the story, it was used as a symbol of friendship. By letting Martin playing with it, signifies the acceptance of his friendship.
