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Within the last decade educational opportunities for Indigenous people have slowly but surely been getting better.

A couple of years ago you wouldn't see many Aboriginal kids graduating but now the number keeps on getting higher thanks to all the Aboriginal programs been put in place in public schools and the more remote areas.

Children in the Remote Areas of Australia who aren't normally exposed to that education are finally receiving the basic skills of being able to read and write.

One Aboriginal program is the "Indigenous Aboriginal Numeracy Competition" which gets local schools together for one day to have fun by simply solving maths equations

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Some strategies to improve Indigenous educational outcomes ~~be~~ have been more successful than others because

It depends on what type of program it is and who it caters to.

The programs that deal with children in remote areas have been working because people are actually sticking to it.

A new program that is being introduced to public schools is actually having the child's Aunty, Mother, Grandmother come in and teach the children because the kids will pay more attention to someone they're close with other than someone they have to make a new bond with
