a) There are a number of reasons why aboriginal people are over represented in the criminal justice system and all these reasons arose from the colonisation of Australia. Today, aboriginal people make up 24% of the prison population. Dispossession from land, loss of culture, loss of family ties, loss of dreaming, introduction of Alcohol and developed racism and discrimination all lead to why Aboriginal people are over-represented in the criminal justice system.

These issues which arose out of the colonisation of Australia are still affecting us today as they have not been fixed or mended.
