a) The source shows a symbolic representation of the importance of country in Indigenous peoples' lives today. "The dispossession, dislocation and isolation of Indigenous people has led to ^{it being} a very hard for Indigenous people to claim land. As the source says "Those who have been most dispossessed are least able to access native title".

To Aboriginal peoples prior to colonisation - land provided everything for them. Aboriginal peoples were stripped of this connection and forced to live in places such as reserves and missions.

Aboriginal people still have a strong connection to country today though it does not provide for them in the same way.

The importance of gaining ~~the~~ land rights and native title is something that is hard for Indigenous people to explain. They want to be able to connect with sacred sites and important places of their ancestors and this is also shown in the source.

Vincent Langari is a Gurindji elder who ^{is able to} relate ~~to~~ to his land and therefore this made it an easier battle for him to claim Native Title.
