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a) In today's society Aboriginality is expressed in many ways and through many types of media.

Today there are various Aboriginal TV Shows such as 'Move it Mob style' (ABC 3), 'Living black' (SBS) and 'Bush Tucker' (ABC 3). There are also many news papers and magazines that are Aboriginal owned such as 'National Indigenous Times', ^{and} 'Deadly Vibe'. There are also several indigenous movies including 'The Sapphires', 'Ten Canoes', 'Bran Nue Dae', and 'Samson and Delilah', such forms of Aboriginal expressions express culture, tradition, knowledge and historical facts that enable Aboriginal people to learn more about their culture and allow the wider Australia to understand Aboriginal tradition and culture.

There are also many Aboriginal artists including performing artists like Jimmy Little, Jessica Mauboy, Troy Cassadilly, Casey Donovan and Gnomaway Yirapingu. There are also many visual artists including Bronwyn Beecroft, Laddie Timbery and Noel Wellington. These forms of Aboriginal expressions allow insight into tradition, history and culture. Through creative arts indigenous people are able to express themselves freely and teach others of indigenous struggles.

Indigenous dancers such as the Bangarra Dance Company, Pan Ooche and East Naurua ~~Dance~~ Public School Dance group, teach through visual expression stories of Aboriginal culture, tradition and history.
