In today's society, Indigenous Australians experience lower levels of employment, overcrowding, lower incomes, lower education levels, higher status in the criminal justice system, below average health and

are much more dependant on welfare. From such low determinants, Indigenous people's often feel as though they are not ~~seen~~ as equal or important, a sad reality. This often leads to drug and alcohol abuse, and ~~encourages~~ this contributes to the ongoing cycle that has resulted in such low economic status.

Laddie Timbervy owns a shop in Huskisson, 20 minutes drive out of Nowra. The shop is located in The Lady Denman Heritage site and displays all types of Aboriginal artefacts, arts and crafts. Laddie Timbervy ~~sells~~ hand makes didgeridoo's, boomerangs, and all sorts of artefacts that relate to his indigenous culture. The business has been in Laddies family for over 150 years and the Timbervys are known for their spectacular 'burning in' of wood, a technique used to craft Aboriginal symbols on artefacts. Laddie Timbervy's shop offers knowledge about the local Aboriginal community and there are pictures everywhere, which Laddie tells the story of an animal. Himself and David Little offer Bush Tucker tours for locals and tourists, and they also do educational talks within schools. Laddie understands the importance of traditional and cultural contemporary expressions of heritage and identity and keeping it alive to maintain socio economic status for Aboriginal people as it is Aboriginal art which led Laddie out of his bad ways, into a successful career.

There are many sports people who have come from Nowra including south Rabbitohs player Dylan Farrell and Touch Football player Jeff Wellington who represented Australia. Both Dylan and Jeff incorporate their ideas of sport into teaching young

children of the area the importance of a good education to be able to achieve great things in life. Both men go to local schools teaching and passing on skills to Indigenous and non Indigenous children. The Wreck Bay soccer club also provides a hobby for people and Indigenous people around the area who can use sport as a way of getting fit and increasing quality of life.

Within the area many talents have been born and raised such as the famous singer Jimmy Little and the country musician Troy Cassadaily whose dad lives on the mission at Orient Point (Jerringa) a 15 minute drive from Nowra. These two men are a sign of hope and idolisation that Indigenous kids can achieve their goal through traditional and contemporary forms of expression.

Young talents such as Tanika Lohesbrough, whom is from Wreck Bay (twenty minutes drive from Nowra) played the young Gail in the upcoming film The Sapphires, prove that expressions of Aboriginality provide a new pathway for success. This is also seen through the Aboriginal Nowra East dance group who perform around the Nowra area, sharing and providing knowledge on traditional culture and
