In 2008, the Council of Australian Government (COAG) agreed to a set of national policy targets to guide the design and delivery of programs and services for Indigenous people.

These targets known as 'Closing the Gap' targets are:

Close the life-expectancy gap within a generation

Halve the gap in mortality rates for Indigenous children under five within a decade

Ensure access to early childhood education for all Indigenous four-year-olds in remote communities within five years

Halve the gap in reading, writing and numeracy achievements for children within a decade

Halve the gap for Indigenous students in Year 12 (or equivalent) attainment rates by 2020

Halve the gap in employment outcomes within a decade

- 6 With reference to ONE of the 'Closing the Gap' targets, explain how addressing racism can help to 'close the gap'. 4

By addressing racism, Australia's indigenous peoples can feel a greater sense of acceptance and belonging within their community, allowing them to seek an education in the hope that they can further advanced into comfortable employment. By allowing Australia's Indigenous people to be more involved in society ^{it} and increases their physical movements, allowing Australia to see the Gap closed in the "life-expectancy" rates of Indigenous and -4- non-Indigenous people.
