Aileys piece deals with the hardship and slavery of the african american woman that they were faced with by the men of his home town.

Aileys accompaniment consist of three parts. His music ^{is} very traditional and gospel as he feels this best represents his interpretation.

His Second Song, 'I'm on a train' really enhances his intent of his piece as it is the only one with words and the steps he has chosen for his motif relate to the lyrics of the song.

Ailey uses a ~~piece~~ piece of fabric to aid him in demonstrating

his Concept.

I look at the fabric as another motif. It gets scrunched ~~to~~ up, thrown, layed out and stretched.

Although the fabric only aids the dancer putting across its intent, It plays a big part in emphasising the hardship and sorrow these woman faced, And can be looked at as a piece of emotion the dancer uses to portray how they're feeling.

Ailey's work 'cry' is a world renowned piece that depicts the lifestyle and culture of an african american woman of that era. Although he died in 1989 due to aids, the work of ailey still lives on through his company in America today.
